CLIENT PROFILE – STEVE SAMARIN



Thirty years ago in 1993, Steve Samarin started a construction company that was focused mainly on residential renovations, decks, and fences. For the first twenty years, he ran three to four crews and kept busy with large renovation projects. For the past decade, however, Steve has had to slow down and scale back his company's operations as his eyesight deteriorated – but he hasn't quit. Quite the opposite. Steve has managed to stay hands-on in his business.

In 2021, after researching guide dog schools, Steve chose to attend Canadian Guide Dogs for the Blind because he liked that the program was focused on working closely with individuals with visual impairments. Though he felt a bit nervous about being away from family and friends, Steve says of his time at CGDB that, "the trainers and staff quickly made me feel comfortable and welcome. And once I started working with Jerry, I knew it was all going to be worthwhile."

Before heading in for training, Steve and his family were a bit apprehensive, as they had never owned a dog before. "But Jerry quickly won everyone's heart," he says. "Our two cats let him know who was boss on day one and since then, everyone is content," Steve kids. Jerry, whom Steve describes as a black Lab with a great temperament, has become his best friend and constant companion at home and at work.

Though he is no longer quoting major jobs for potential clients, Steve continues to take on smaller projects near his home in Burlington, Ontario. Steve figured he would finally retire in 2021, after being paired with Jerry, but you can still find him on a job site a day-or-two a week. "When you do something for 30-plus years, it's kind of hard to get out – They keep pulling you back in," he laughs. "I'm still doing things for friends and family."

Steve tells us about a job he took on recently, replacing doors in a house for a customer. Working now mainly by feel - and with

30-plus years of experience at his fingertips - Steve explains how he is able to stay hands-on in the business. "I can't really measure or cut anymore. I haven't been able to do that for years," he tells us. "My employee, whom I have worked with for 25 years, knows that if a job requires a task like hanging doors, he'll need to make all the cuts. I can put the frames together and install the doors with my hands," he says. "And if I have a question, I check with him. I think he knows what I can see, or why I can't see a certain thing – we don't have to say it."

Over the years, the duo has developed best practices, as well, to make sure it is safe. Steve says, "It's about how I get around the jobsite – my helper is fully aware of that. He knows that everything needs to be kept clear and all the tools need to be kept in the same spot."

Though Jerry doesn't get his own tool belt, you will often find him nearby on Steve's jobsites, too – though safely out of the way. "Sometimes we get him to drag a piece of wood out of the van," Steve jokes. "Jerry has a pen in the work van; right behind the front seats," he tells us. "He loves running around with us in the work truck. We take him to the hardware store or wherever we need to go."

Off the job site Steve says that, thanks to CGDB and being matched with Jerry, his life has completely changed. He says that having a guide dog gives him the confidence and independence to do more than he thought possible. "I now feel comfortable walking out on my own with Jerry; going to meet friends for coffee or lunch and even doing some shopping. These are things I never would have done by myself prior to having him."

Though he may have been forced to scale back the size of his projects over the years, with Jerry by his side – and in the back of the work van – it's clear that Steve will keep finding a way to stay hands-on and get the job done. ■

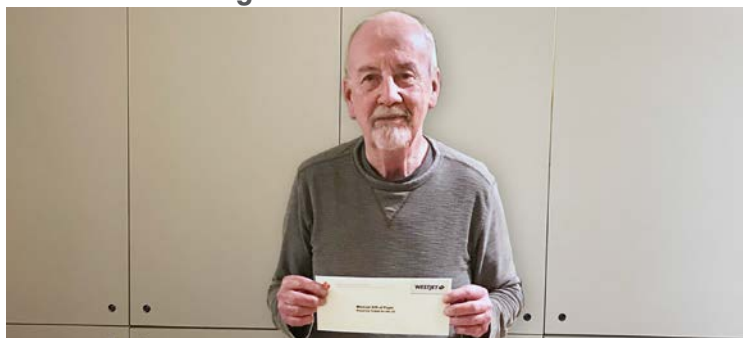
Pet Photos with Santa
